The aim behind this initiative is to bring together a **new generation of creative Europeans**, who are able to cooperate across languages, borders and disciplines to address the big societal challenges and skills shortages that Europe faces.

These transnational alliances will be the European universities of the future, promoting European values and identity, and revolutionizing the quality and competitiveness of European higher education.

Education across Europe is rapidly changing, with deep technological and structural changes affecting teaching and learning.





Key cooperation principles

- Students, doctoral candidates and staff can move seamlessly (physically or virtually) to study, train, teach, do research, work, or share services in any of the partner institutions. **Embedded mobility at all levels**, including at Bachelor, Master and Doctoral levels. **At least 50%** of the students within the alliance should benefit from such mobility, be it physical, virtual or blended.
- Students customize their choice of where and what to study. **New joint** and flexible curricula, integrating innovative pedagogies, including the use of the latest digital technologies. While content is personalised, cooperation is global.
- Practical and/or work-based experience is provided by external mentors to foster an **entrepreneurial mindset** and develop civic engagement.

International Summer School

Numerous academic workshops

Create a common space where students, teachers and administrators can work together without administrative, cultural and social obstacles

Freedom of teaching and research

Closely **interconnecting with regions**, creating a trans-European ecosystem for innovation and entrepreneurship

Promotion of **innovative methodologies and practical lessons** aimed at the labor market.

Redressing inequalities in university capabilities to attract funding Take the best of the tradition of each country's culture and will aim to **integrate popular and academic culture.**







Examples of good practices

New and innovative network that builds upon existing bi-national and trinational agreements between the participating universities

Merge the various **mobility agreements**

To contribute to the development of a knowledge-based European economy, with **inclusion of Associate Partners**.

Promote active European citizenship within a shared European environment, Include collaborations with the public and private sector in the region.

Offer a coordinated program in training and research around the theme of the **Sustainable Urban Development**.

Students will be free to select their pathway according to pre-determined curricula but also choice optional ECTS, which allow them to include multiple perspectives into their studies according to their preferences.

Develop the digital platform, creating the contents and the rules of the learning modules;

Design mobility programmes taking into account the inequality of means by developing tools for low-cost mobility;

Test and evaluate the new curricula and learning programmes;

Strengthen the collaboration among partners and encourage shared projects, focused on the global challenges;
